See you on a rally soon.

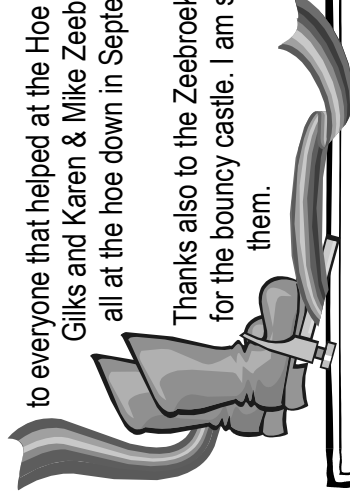

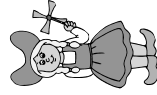
Can you please pass on our thanks from the North London Centre to all involved in the Country & Western weekend.

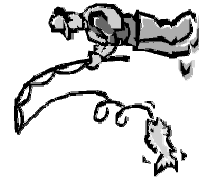

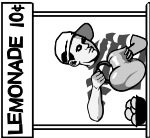

EAR	(plural ears) organ of hearing : the organ of hearing and balance in vertebrates that, in mammals, is divided into three parts, the external, middle, and inner ear.
ERA	distinctive period of history : a period of time made distinctive by a significant development, feature, event, or personality.
ERG	(plural ergs) unit for measuring energy : the unit of energy or work in the centimetre-gram-second system equal to the work done by a force of one dyne acting through a distance of one centimetre.
SEA	(plural seas) salt waters of Earth : the great body of salt water that covers a large portion of the Earth
SAG	(3rd person present singular sags) bend under weight : to bend downward in the middle, or to hang or droop instead of remaining firm or level, or to make something bend in this way, usually through having to support excessive weight.
ASS	(plural ass-es) animal resembling horse with long ears : an animal resembling a small horse with long ears, sometimes used as a beast of burden. The donkey is a domesticated descendant of the wild ass.
ARE	part of "be" : the plural and second person singular present tense of the verb "be".
AGE	(plural ag-es) how old somebody or something is : the length of time that somebody or something has existed, usually expressed in years.
RAG	(plural rags) small piece of cloth : a small piece or scrap of usually old or unwanted cloth taken, for example, from torn-up old clothing, often used for cleaning, polishing, or applying liquid substances.
GAS	(plural gas-es) substance such as air : a substance such as air that is neither a solid nor a liquid at ordinary temperatures and that has the ability to expand indefinitely.
GAR	(plural gars) American freshwater fish : a large primitive freshwater fish found in North and Central America that has a heavy armour of bony scales and a long toothy jaw. <i>Also called garfish or garpike</i>

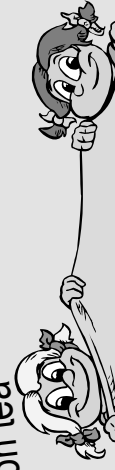

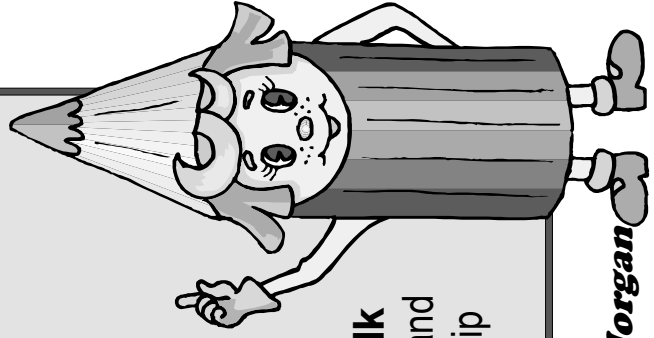

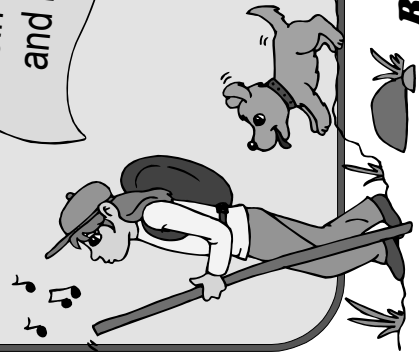

ERAS	See era
ERGS	See erg
SEAS	See sea
SEAR	(3rd person present singular sears) burn something : to burn or scorch something with an application of intense heat.
SAGE	(plural sa-ges) wise person : somebody who is regarded as knowledgeable, wise, and experienced, especially a man of advanced years revered for his wisdom and good judgment.
SAGS	See sag
AGES	See age
RAGE	(plural rag-es) extreme anger : sudden and extreme anger, or an outburst of strong anger.
RAGS	See rag
GEAR	(plural gears) device to transmit motion : a mechanism that transmits motion from one part to another part for performing a specific function.
GARS	See gar
SEARS	See sear
SAGES	See sage
ASSES	See ass
RAGES	See rage
GEARS	See gear
GASES	See gas
GRASS	(plural grass-es) green plant that forms lawns : a low green narrow-leaved plant that grows in fields and gardens, is eaten by animals such as cows and sheep, and is used to make lawns and playing fields.

Could **ALL** ralliers please note that it is a part of the clubs rules, for insurance purposes, that the **Rally Envelope** be displayed clearly in your Caravan/Motorhome whilst you are on a rally field.

Motoring in Europe? Be SAFE, Be LEGAL

insurance Policies: Somewhere in the small print of most Motor Insurance Policies is a statement to the effect that it is the **driver's responsibility** to ensure that the vehicle complies with the law and is roadworthy for the Country he intends to visit. Failure to do so could result in you insurance company repudiating liability under the policy.

Failure to Comply in the event of prosecution and conviction for failing to comply with legal requirements could cost you dearly. Arresting officers have powers to impose 'on the spot' fines which if not paid in CASH for the country you are in could lead to impounding and imprisonment.

Headlamp Adapters must be fitted even if you do not intend to drive at night. Failure to have them fitted renders your vehicle **unfit** for use on the road. (see above)

Warning Triangles must be used if your vehicle breaks down or is involved in an accident and placed 50—150 metres behind your vehicle to warn approaching traffic. **Two** Warning Triangles are required for Spain.

GB Plate is required by International Law to indicate Country of Registration.

Spare Bulbs & Fuses should be taken as lights etc must be in working order even in daylight. Failure to be able to fix a blown bulb would render your vehicle **unfit**. (see above)

First Aid Kit & Fire Extinguisher are needed to comply with the European Good Samaritan Law which requires every driver to stop and provide assistance when encountering an accident or incident, providing it is safe to do so.

Reflective Vest is now required by everybody providing roadside assistance, or leaving a stranded vehicle. This is now a legal requirement in a number of European Countries.
