What other rules and regulations should I know about?

- ◆ Towing mirrors are a legal requirement if the caravan that is being towed is wider than the towing vehicle and rearward vision is restricted.
- ◆ Towing mirrors must be removed when driving solo
- ◆ A caravan must have a rear number plate. This must match that of the towing vehicle and be illuminated at night.
- ◆ TV's used in caravans are covered by the owners domestic TV licence as long as the caravan occupants are residents where the licence is registered and TV's at home are not used at the same time.
- ◆ Caravans do not have to under go MOT tests. Basic safety checks and maintenance are the owners responsibility.
- ◆ Caravan Insurance is not compulsory but is highly recommended.
- ◆ Passengers are not permitted to travel in a caravan. Pets are allowed.
- ◆ All safety regulations for car tyres apply to those on caravans
- ◆ Tyres on the same axle must be of the same type and size, although not necessarily from the same manufacturer
