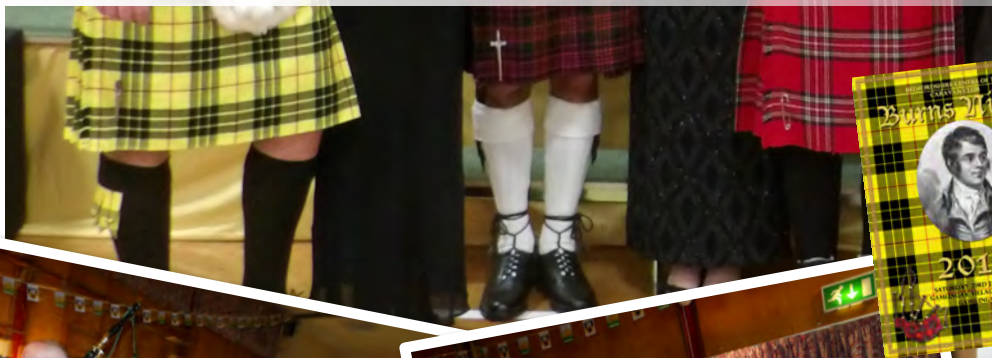
Linda Horn and John Moules with the help of Bronya did a grand job.

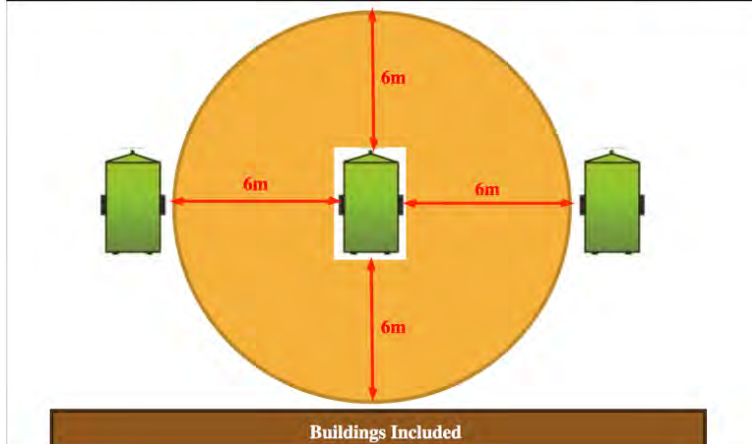

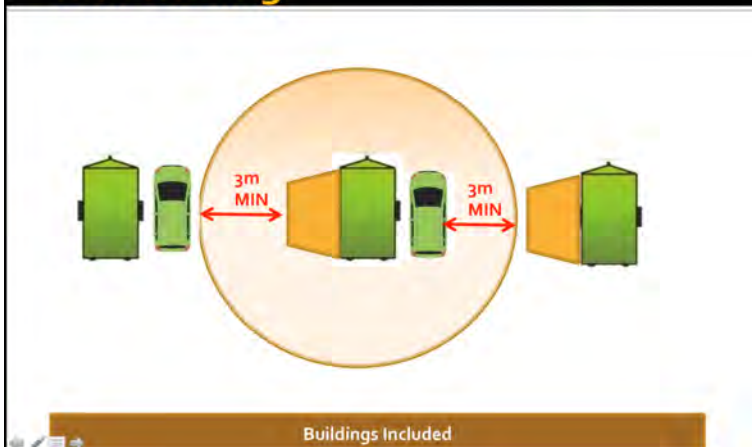
Model Standards for Touring Caravan Sites

There should be 6 metres separation between the facing walls of a caravan or motorhome and a building; however, that 6 metres space could be used for a towing vehicle or awning so long as there is still 3 metres clear space within that 6 metres.

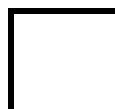
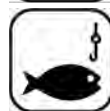

BARBECUES AND FIRES Only barbecues are permitted on site. Please place disposable barbecues on bricks (which are provided at the dish washing area). Fires of any form are not permitted on the park.

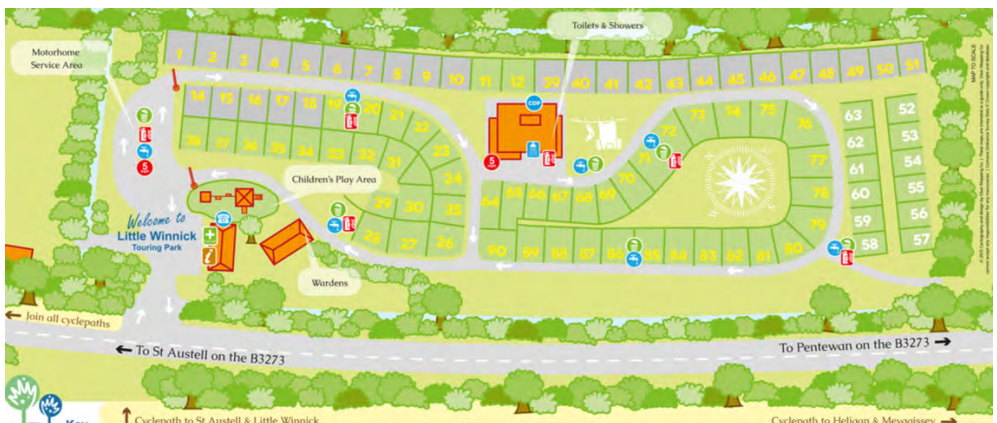
GADGET AND MOBILE PHONE CHARGING Available at reception. We do not charge for this service but we do ask that you donate a donation in the charity box per item per charge. This service is only available during reception opening hours.

RUBBISH DISPOSAL AND RECYCLING All recyclables must be sorted into the correct bin - please do not put non recyclables in the recycling bins. Please put general waste in the dustbins provided.

SPEED LIMIT AND VISITORS Please request the 5mph speed limit across the whole site. Please do not allow visitors access through the barrier - ask them to report to reception for access, this is for the security and safety of the site.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS Accommodation and entry to the park is conditional on you accepting and adhering to our full terms and conditions which are available on our website or in reception.

ONSITE SHOP Visit our onsite shop for all your essential camping needs including milk, free range eggs, snacks, ice creams and newspapers (please order papers by 6pm for the next day). In busier periods we also stock fresh bread and cakes as well as bacon, burgers and sausages from our local butcher (please check when we are having deliveries).

PITCHING UP Pitch within the pitch dividers. On handstanding pitches please ensure everything is pitched on the hand standing provided including awning and pup tents. Please use the electric hook up allocated to your pitch number. One vehicle can be parked on your pitch. Please ask reception where to park additional vehicles. We ask that you vacate your pitch by 11am on day of departure.

ELECTRIC HOOK UPS These are designed for light loads such as televisions and lighting. Our hook ups are regularly tested and we only trip if there is a faulty appliance plugged in or they are over loaded. Please visit reception to have your hook up reset if it does trip.

WIFI, PHONE & TELEVISION SIGNAL There is WIFI available across the whole site. Access codes can be purchased through our online portal page or by visiting reception. The park is situated in a valley in rural Cornwall so there is limited phone and television signal. A limited number of hand standing pitches have tv aerial points provided. A pay phone is provided next to reception.

FIRE SAFETY AND FIRST AID Please familiarise yourself with your nearest fire extinguisher. The first aid point is in reception.

In an emergency phone 999, our post code is PL26 6DL

FACILITIES On site there are free showers and toilets, chemical toilet disposal points (Elian point), a coin operated laundry and children's play area. A freezer is located in reception for your freezer blocks.

NOISE AND MUSIC To be kept to a reasonable level at all times, please respect your neighbours and ensure you are not a nuisance to other campers on site. If you are affected by noisy or nuisance neighbours please let us know immediately. Quiet hours are between 11pm - 7am. We ask that all campers, young and old are back at their own pitches by 10pm.
